# **Develop Good Reading Habits**

Read to your children, with your children, in front of your children. Set as ide guarding reading times in your family. Go to the library. Browse in bookstores. Listen to audio books together.

Older children can keep a reading notebook and have a place in it for keeping track of the books they want to read and have read.

Making a written plan for summer reading can be supportive. This can build interest in and enthusiasm for summer reading.

Talking to your child about reading is essential. You can share your own summer reading plans. You could also ask your child questions like:

- Is there a series that you've started that you'd like to read more of?
- Is there an author that you really like right now?
- What type of books are you in the mood for?
- Is there a book you've heard of from someone else that you've been wanting to read?
- Is there a longer-than-usual book that you've been wanting to read when you had extra time?
- Are you going on a long plane or car trip that will give you extra time to read?
- Where do you think you'll do most of your reading this summer?

Set up some times to chat about books they are reading over the summer. These informal social meetings often keep kids reading all summer long.
